## FIELD RULES FOR BUMBLE BEE RANCH

- 1. Put your manure in a pile or manure bucket. We will come around and pick it up throughout your stay. If it is not in a pile, we will not pick it up.
- 2. Do not throw your manure over the white fence onto the road behind it.
- 3. **The trashcans are not for your manure and straw.** They are for trash only.
- 4. Water hose bibs are community property. Please share.
- 5. Dogs must be contained. There are "Dog Eating" cows on property. Should your dog dare to enter their pasture, they probably won't make it out alive. Keep your dog in check and pick up their poop. My animals should not have to suffer because you are coming to visit plus my chickens, ducks and geese are \$200 a piece if your dog injures or kills them.
- 6. No animals in the pavilion during meals. Period.
- 7. No camping in the pavilion area.
- 8. Your horses are not allowed to eat grass inside the split rail of the pavilion.
- 9. Those that have electrical hookups around the office cannot keep their horses on the same side. Please house your horses across the road. We'd like to keep what little grass we have.
- 10. There are three showers/bathrooms on property.
  - A. Office
  - B. Pavilion
  - C. Tack room
- 11. There is a farrier on property for a fee. Please call or text the Kelly, Ranch Manager, if needed at 623-694-1165.
- 12. There is an AED in the office. Everyone at the ranch is trained in CPR/first aid and Rylee is a certified EMT.

- 13. Ranch Manager's phone number: 623-694-1165 (Kelly) *Please only call between 9PM and 7AM if it is an emergency.*
- 14. You feed your horse with your own feed.
- 15. You can have an open fire, but it must be above ground.
- 16. You can buy hay from the ranch at \$5 above the ranch's cost. Bermuda and Alfalfa
- 17. There is Night Shade in the fields. We have done everything to get rid of it except for harsh chemicals. Please be aware of where your horse is contained and pull up any that you see that they can reach. Throw it in the trash so it cannot reroot. It is not common for a horse to want to eat the Night Shade.

## Night Shade is hazardous to all animals and humans if digested.
